Dear Counselors,

Enclosed is the application form for the Elizabeth Mitchell/Merle Ivy Scholarships, awarded annually by Tau Chapter of Alpha Delta Kappa, a sorority of education professionals. Tau Chapter will award two (2) \$500 scholarships which are one-time awards and are granted to honor two outstanding educators who each left a lasting mark on the Pascagoula-Gautier School District and its students.

Elizabeth Mitchell taught mathematics and physics to three generations of area students. Merle Ivy, a teacher, principal, and district administrator, was instrumental in the creation of the school district's special education program.

Any student who is a graduating high school senior in these school districts - Jackson County, Moss Point, Pascagoula-Gautier, Resurrection - or a community college student may apply. The applicant should have a grade point average and recommendations indicating a commitment to learning in a college/university. Financial need should be indicated by the applicant who has a need, but this is not a requirement to receive a scholarship. This scholarship does not limited to specific college majors; however, extra consideration will be given to applicants who plan to major in an area of education with plans to become a teacher.
